- (a) Write a short note on the origin and evaluation of ancient Greek drama.
- (b) Discuss the major phases in the development of Indian classical literature, highlighting the key genres and authors of each phase.*
- (c) Discuss the feminist perspective of Abhijnanasakuntalam. How does the play portray the female characters, particularly Shakuntala?
- (d) Discuss the themes of love, loss and redemption in Abhijnanasakuntalam. How does Kalidasa explore these themes through the characters and plot of the play?

- (e) Compare and contrast the characters of Charudatta and Rakshasa in Act One of Mrichchhakatika. How does Sudraka use these characters to explore the themes of good and evil, poverty and wealth, and love and lust?
- (f) Discuss the different types of rasa and their effects on the audience, as described in Bharata's Natyasastra, 'Chapter-VI'.
- (g) Bharata's Natyasastra, 'Chapter-VI', is a timeless classic that has had a profound influence on Indian theatre and culture. Discuss the relevance of this chapter in the 21st century and explain how its insights can be used to create innovative and meaningful theatrical performances.

- (d) Analyse the significance of the title, Abhijnanasakuntalam Discuss how the theme of recognition is central to the plot and character development of the play.
- (e) Critically examine the role of the characters Aryaka and Sthavaraka in the play, *Mrichchhakatika*.
- (f) Discuss the significance of the ring in Abhijinanasakuntalam. How does it serve as a symbol of love, loss and recognition?
